with disabilities. Julia used this training to teach basic skills to folks in a school setting.

Boston bar was their first stop, and soon after, the big city of Vancouver. Julia worked in a daycare there. The big city life took some getting used to, especially with very little English. We left on March 4th with a drive to Vancouver, and came back on March 12 to Vancouver and back to Kelowna on the 13th.



Celebrating 20 Years: Richter Street

The home on Richter Street received its temporary license on February 19,1986 and was granted full license on December 16, 1987. The house has been home to a number of individuals over the last 20 years. However the people who currently reside there have been there for almost the entire time of the homes existence. The house was originally licensed for four permanent residents and one respite person. On April 1, 1994 the respite space was converted to a permanent spot and a new person moved in.





This residence was originally set up as a transition house for people wanting independent living, it was to serve as a "training home" because of its ideal location in the community. Two other homes that were owned by KDSCL became the independent living homes. Richter remained home to the individuals currently living there. They have been childhood friends, attended school together, their mothers babysat each other's children and as they left their parent's homes became house mates. How fast time fly's!!!
